Anti-Bullying Procedure

What Happens When Bullying is Reported?

- Washington has a **zero-tolerance rule** on bullying
- When bullying is reported, school staff **immediately** investigates.
- The school staff will meet with all the students involved. (Get both sides of the story)
- The identification of the student being bullied will be protected
- Investigations may take time to assure that all facts have been shared by the bully
- After the investigation, all parents will be contacted with the solution to the bullying problem.
- The incident will be documented by the teacher or administrator.
- Further bullying problems by the student will result in progressive discipline action in accordance to the district's discipline handbook.



What Can Students Do to Prevent Bullying?

1. Tell your parent or a trusted adult like a teacher.
2. Telling on bullying is not tattling.
3. Don't fight back.
4. Try not to show that you are upset, that is what the bully wants to see.
5. Calmly tell the student to stop and then walk away.
6. Use humor if this is easy for you to do.
7. Don't ignore the situation....tell an adult!!!



What Can Parents Do to Help Prevent Bullying?

1. Children don't usually tell their parents when they are being bullied. (You have to ask questions)
2. If your child is being bullied, listen to your child. Be supportive and get information about the bullying.
3. Contact your student's teacher or principal. Don't tell them to take matters into their own hands. (It is our responsibility to deal with the bully)
4. Present all the information about the bullying incident to the school.
5. Please work with your student and school staff. We need your support to help us make your child feel safe.
6. Encourage your student to report bullying even if it is not happening to them!!! (Help others out)
