

## Peer-to-Peer File Sharing Programs

Over the past several years a number of peer to peer (P2P) applications have been developed that allow users to participate in a file sharing “community”. We have noticed an increase in the installation of P2P programs on district computers. These programs use a large amount of bandwidth, open the district to legal liabilities/copyright issues, create security issues and open the network to exposure to viruses. The district cannot allow you to install these programs on any district computer, nor are you allowed to use the district network to run the programs.
