

## Students

### Equal Educational Opportunities

Equal educational and extracurricular opportunities shall be available for all students without regard to color, race, nationality, religion, gender, sexual orientation, ancestry, age, beliefs, physical or mental disability, gender identity, status of being homeless, or order of protection status.

Further, the District will not knowingly enter into agreements with any entity or any individual that discriminates against students on the basis of gender or any other protected status.

The District remains viewpoint neutral when granting access to school facilities under Board policy 8:20, *Community Use of School Facilities*.

Any student may file a discrimination grievance by using Board policy 2:260, *Uniform Grievance Procedure*.

### Sex Equity

No student shall, be denied equal access to programs, activities, services, or benefits or be limited in the exercise of any right, privilege, advantage, or denied equal access to educational and extracurricular programs and activities based on gender, sexual orientation, or gender identity.

Any student may file a sex equity complaint by using Board policy 2:260, *Uniform Grievance Procedure*.

### Administrative Implementation

The Superintendent shall appoint a Nondiscrimination Coordinator. The Superintendent or designee shall use reasonable measures to inform staff members and students of this policy and grievance procedure.

A student may appeal the Board's resolution of the complaint to the Regional Superintendent of Schools (pursuant to 105 ILCS 5/3-10 of The School Code) and, thereafter, to the State Superintendent of Education (pursuant to 105 ILCS 5/2-3.8 of The School Code).
